This grand historic building was built in 1909 for Sears and Roebuck as their catalog division's distribution and warehouse center. It is strategically located at the edge of downtown Dallas.

In the mid-1990s a developer acquired this 1,100,000 square foot property from Sears with the idea of turning the building into loft apartments.
